Requirement

HQ US Army special operations Command, in Fort Bragg NC required supply of assorted paper targets for the first Special Warfare Training Group (SWTG). Steel targets were constructed of abrasive resistant AR 500 Steel. The "AR 500" is a steel mill designation that is equal to a Brinell hardness scale of ~500. All steel targets will be a minimum 3/8 inch thick. The AR 500 steel is tempered through hardened wear resistant grades of abrasion resistant steel plate and used for severe impact. This is the industry standard for metal targets. This contract was a firm fixed price, multiple year, indefinite delivery indefinite quantity (IDIQ) contract. The Ordering periods were from March 2017 through March 2022. The project location was : HHD, D CO, 2nd BN, 1st. SWTG (A) Bldg. O-3550 Mcridge Rd. Fort Bragg NC 28310

Challenges

•The client had openly made it clear in the contract that the quality of the Steel Target is an important issue and would terminate the contract in the case of Incompetency.
